ISO grants exclusive distribution rights to national standards bodies within each ISO member country. Therefore, several ISO 10303 documents are now available **FOR A PRICE**, from the national standards bodies in each country.

ISO specifically exempts the members of an ISO standards development organization from the ISO copyright restriction when the intended use is that of further standards development. Therefore, the copying of an ISO copyrighted standards document is acceptable within the SC4 committee so long as the copy is only used for purposes of standards development and balloting. The rules apply equally to both the paper form and to the electronic form of a standards document. However, ISO has made a specific exception for the EXPRESS listings and will allow them to be freely available for DIS, FDIS, and IS documents. These files are available for distribution without copyright restrictions (see SOLIS).

The SC4 Secretariat, in consultation with ISO, has developed the following guidance:

1. Copies of **DIS**, **FDIS**, and **IS** documents may be given to SC4 members or distributed to attendees of SC4 and SC4/WG meetings only if the intended use is that of ballot review or continued standards development.
2. All other personnel requesting copies will be referred to their national standards body to purchase a copy.
3. ISO Geneva will sell DIS, FDIS, and IS documents to individuals if the individual's national standards body has difficulty in furnishing the copies.
4. No distinction is made between copying the electronic form or the paper form of a standards document.
